# **Terminology:**

- Activity- The use of facility being undertaken.
- Hazard- Something with the potential to cause harm. Harm can be physical, chemical, biological or psychological.
- **Control Measures** Actions taken to prevent hazard being realised. Control measures can include such areas as training, supervision, safe systems of work, maintenance procedures, physical measures such as guarding and personal protective equipment.
- Likelihood the chances of harm occurring on a scale of 1 to 5 with 1 being highly unlikely and 5 being highly likely
- **Risk Rating-** Multiply the likelihood figure by the severity figure to get the risk rating after the existing control measures have been considered.
- **Severity** the level of harm/injury caused by the accident or incident, on a scale of 1 to 5 with 1 being First aid required and 5 being a fatality.

The Action Plan is the statement of measures put in place to address and reduce the risks. The list below identifies actions which may suitable for managing the risks identified in your toilets. #### **BUILDINGS AND SYSTEMS**

#### Measures could include:

- Legionella test undertaken before opening
- Water, heating, gas, electrical supply, security, ventilation, fire exits points
- · A full clean prior to opening

# **SOCIAL DISTANCING**

# Measures could include:

- A one in and one out policy if not members of the same family
- Markings on the ground at 2m spacing to ensure social distance queuing
- A maximum number of queue positions so as not to interfere with those using the public space beyond
- A one way system and clear waiting point which allows the last person using the facilities to access safely without coming into
  contact with the waiting queue. This will be marked on the ground by a clear line or by using a temporary barrier at least 1m high.

- If possible that any access door is propped open to prevent handling
- That the facility is closed during cleaning to protect cleaners

#### **CLEANING AND CLEANLINESS OF HARD SURFACES**

# Measures could include:

- Disinfecting objects which are contaminated with bodily fluids
- Disinfecting areas of high contact such as doors and door handles, door locks, toilet seats and flushes, toilet roll dispensers, sinks and taps, disposable towel dispensers, soap dispensers, hand dryers, urinals, feminine hygiene sanitary bins
- Use of disposable cloths or paper roll and disposable mop heads to clean all hard surfaces, floors, chairs, door handles and sanitary fittings
- Any cloths and mop heads used must be disposed of appropriately.

#### **PUBLIC HYGIENE**

## Measures could include:

- Using signs and posters to build awareness of
  - o Good hand washing, using soap and water for at least 20 seconds following NHS guidance
  - Avoid touching your face
  - o Cough or sneeze into your arm
  - Dispose of waste in the bins provided
  - o Avoid unnecessary touching of hard surfaces inside the building
- Ensuring that soap and water are available at all times
- Provision of hand sanitiser with directions that it is for use before entering the facilities
- Setting clear guidance on the use of the public toilets
- Setting clear guidance for the cleaning of toilets to ensure they are kept clean and used safely.
- Wherever possible replace hand dryers with the use of disposable paper towels for hand washing facilities ensuring secure storage and safe dispensing.
- Providing more water bins and more frequent waste collection including for disposable paper towels

Reinforce the need for social distancing

#### MANAGING STAFF AND CONTRACTORS AT WORK

#### Measures could include:

- Written agreement from staff that they are prepared to enter the facility and undertake the work
- A copy of a staff-based risk assessment is provided by any contractor providing cleaning or maintenance services on site.
- Adequate measures to protect staff/contractors who are working alone
- Where more than one cleaner is required, that they travel separately 1 person per vehicle
- Risk assess cleaning staff in accordance with isolation criteria to ensure that they are eligible to undertake the work
- Managed distancing between cleaners, avoiding face to face contact. Create opportunities for work side-by-side or facing away from each other
- Appropriate PPE including
  - Disposable single use gloves
  - o Disposable single use apron
  - Fluid repellent surgical mask (Type IIR)
- Hand washing for 20 seconds in accordance with NHS guidance after all PPE has been removed
- Clothing to be washed after use
- Ensuring that only those carrying out essential maintenance for the safe running of the toilet are allowed on site
- Strict hygiene rules for all contractors entering the facility
  - o Wash hands / use hand sanitiser on entering the building
  - o Repeat the process when leaving the building
  - o Repeat hand washing hourly if on site for more than 1 hour.
- Ensure that the premises have been adequately cleaned before allowing any maintenance contractors on site.
- Suitable provision of first aid and emergency equipment is available. All accidents at work must be reported in the usual manner
