Cornwall Councillor Martin advised the meeting of the following: -Cornwall Council has delegated the power to Lostwithiel Town Council to designate Shire Hall Moor as a Local Nature Reserve. Discussions between Cornwall Council and Network Rail regarding the new railway footbridge are progressing.

Cornwall Council's Highways Manager & Environment Portfolio Holder have been asked to produce a Best Practice Guide for sowing wild flowers in parks, hedgerows and verges.

Some roads towards Sweetshouse have been resurfaced.

107/19 Cornwall Council Consultation – Planning for Coastal Change Chief Officer Planning Advice Note

It was **resolved** to approve the response as drafted.

'Lostwithiel Town Council has concerns that this Planning for Coastal Change Advice Note appears to rely heavily on information collated for the Shoreline Management Plan 2 (SMP2) in 2011 prior to both of Lostwithiel's recent floods. Furthermore, this SMP2 document makes reference to the existing significant flood risk in Lostwithiel increasing to 250 residential and commercial properties being at risk during a 1 in 200-year event. The Town Council considers this figure conservative. This revised Advice Note needs to be supported by more accurate and up to date information.'
