It was **resolved** to approve the accounting statement in Section 2 of the Annual Return for2024/25 and to authorise Mayor Berryman to sign the Accounting Statement on the 2024/25 Annual Return on behalf of the Town Council. The Accounting Statements having been already signed by RFO on 19/06/25. **Proposer:** DM Rawlings **Seconder:** Mayor Berryman Vote – 7 votes in favour.

080/25 Lostwithiel Town Council Byelection

It was **resolved** to accept Cornwall Council's offer to hold a byelection for the 7 vacant seats on the Council after 10 July 2025 on the basis that the Town Council no longer needs to provide a business case or evidence of interested candidates, noting that the full cost of the byelection will be borne by the Town Council and if contested the costs will likely be higher than the estimated costs of 01 May 25 elections as there will be no cost sharing. Cornwall Council estimate the costs for a contested election would be a maximum of £12,000. The Town Council agreed to meet these costs in order to regain the General Power of Competence.

081/25 Co-option – Casual vacancy

It was noted by Council that the Casual Vacancy arising from the resignation of Phil Wisdom will continue to be advertised as a Casual Vacancy and this one seat will not be filled by election unless 10 electors contact Cornwall Council by 10 July to request an election for this one seat.

082/25 Lostwithiel Design Guidance & Codes

It was **resolved** to formally adopt the final report and to resolve to include the report as part of the Neighbourhood Priorities Statement and to take the recommendations into consideration when providing comments to the Local Planning Authority regarding Planning Applications.

083/25 Land off Cott Road Lostwithiel

It was **resolved** to reply to the developer's agent as follows:-Lostwithiel Town Council welcomes the opportunity to comment on this proposed application and the intention for net biodiversity gain including tree planting to be delivered on site. The Council would also welcome each property being designed to be as energy self-sufficient as possible. The site is not in the Flood Zone but surface water runoff could impact towards the bottom of Mill Hill, if this site goes ahead the Town Council would wish to see the provision of tanking for the surface water runoff and maintenance of said tank. The Council does have concerns regarding the impact that this development could potentially have on the view from Restormel Castle and would also suggest that a reduction in the speed limit on Cott Road would help to mitigate traffic movements created by a further nine properties. **Proposer:** Cllr Eastham Vote – 7 votes in favour

The clerk was further instructed to forward a copy of the recently approved Design Guidance & Codes to the developer's agent.

Councillor Eastham having previously declared a non-registerable interest left the meeting room.

It was **resolved** to approve the request received to use The Parade Lostwithiel for a Gin Festival on Saturday 28 June 2025.
